Key Vocabulary

- Houses - where people live.
- Detached – A house that is not connected to another house.
- Semi-detached – A house that is connected to one other house.
- Railway station – Where a train picks people up from.
- Terraced – A row of houses that are all connected to each other.
- Cottage - a small house, typically one in the country.
- Bungalow - a low house having only one storey
- Flat – A space within a building where people live.
- Caravan - a vehicle equipped for living in, typically towed by a car and used for holidays.
- Parking – where you park a car.
- Main road – A busy, well used road.
- Footpath – Where pedestrians walk.
- Factory - a building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine.
- Office - a room, set of rooms, or building used as a place for commercial or professional work
- Nature reserve - a tract of land managed so as to preserve its plants and physical features.
- Town - a built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city.
- Countryside - the land and scenery of a rural area.
- Country - a nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.
- UK – The United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland)
