our new children in a variety of year groups



# Y1 Parents Phonic Workshop Wednesday 2nd October 2024

Parents have been invited via letter from Mrs Buckley to come to school on Wednesday 2nd October at 6pm to join Mrs Buckley and Mr Jones to support your understanding of phonics and to share some of the terminology and teaching practices we use with the children within Y1.

We hope that this session will help you to feel empowered to help your child with their reading and spelling at home. It is vitally important **Year 1 Parents** attend as your child will be taking the **Phonic Screening Check in June 2024** and this session will aid you in supporting your child at home ready for the check.

# Parents' Evening

You will shortly receive a survey link to book an appointment to meet with your child/ren class teachers. This is an opportunity for you to discuss in private your child's progress and settling into their new class! Time slots are 10 minutes-please keep to times. Your child's work will also be available for you to view in their tray. We ask that children are not present as we wish to have open and honest discussions, which when children are present is inappropriate.

### Attendance

As you are aware we are monitoring attendance throughout school to ensure we reach the 96% Attendance as set by the Government. If your child's attendance drops below 90% you will receive a letter which explains further course of action produced by our Education Welfare Officer, VIP. I would also like to bring to your attention your child's punctuality; if they are late for school after the register closes (8.45am) this will be marked as a 'Late' and this is deemed as an 'unauthorised absence'. If your child is late, you will be required to sign your child/ren into school on the School Entry System in the foyer explaining the reason why.

As per last year we will be sending out information regarding your child's attendance percentage through Marvellous Me so you are aware of your child's attendance throughout the year.

All unauthorised absences are closely monitored by the local authority. If the lateness to school persists, legal action in the form of a Penalty Notice or Prosecution under Section 444 (1) of the Education Act 1996 may follow.

Further to this, you will be aware that the Department of Education made important changes to the law for families wanting to request leave of absence in term time (holidays). As a school we are obliged to inform you that you may be subject to a Penalty Notice issued by the Local Authority if your child's absence from school is unauthorised for a holiday.

### New two penalty notice limit in a three-year period

The three-year rolling period starts for parents when the first penalty notice is issued to them after the 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024.

First offence — the first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £80.00 per parent, per child paid within 21 days. This increases to £160.00 per parent, per child if paid after day 21, until day 28. Any non-payment of the Penalty Notice may be referred to the Magistrates Court.

**Second offence**: (within 3 years) — the second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be £160.00 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Any non-payment of the Penalty Notice may be referred to the Magistrates Court.

**Third offence** and Any Further Offences (within 3 years) – the third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case may be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court under s.444 of the Education Act (1996) or other legal interventions considered. The Magistrates' Court can order fines up to £2500.00 per parent, per child.

## Governors / Local Academy Board (LAB)

Birches First School is one of the members of Codsall Multi Academy Trust (CMAT, established October 2016) along with Codsall Middle School and St Nicholas First School. CMAT is governed by its Trustees and Members and operates within the confines of the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Each school within the MAT is supported and governed at local level by a Local Academy Board which is led by a Lead. Our LAB Lead is Mrs Karen Lawley who can be contacted by email on <a href="mailto:gov.Karen@birches.staffs.sch.uk">gov.Karen@birches.staffs.sch.uk</a> Karen carries out many of the roles previously carried out by a Chair of Governors.

### The Local Academy Board's (LABs) Role

LABs are expected to have a strong focus on core strategic functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils
- Overseeing the school's curriculum and pedagogy
- Monitoring and challenging the progress of the school in achieving its priorities
- Ensuring all pupils are included and have opportunities to thrive

### Categories of LAB Member

There are five types of school LAB Member on our Board:

Parent Members – elected by the parents and carers of children in school

Co-opted Members – selected by the Governing Body to bring the expertise of the local community to the school

Staff Members – elected by employees of the school, with the exception of the Headteacher who holds an ex – officio role.

### LAB Members

LAB members are typically elected for a term of 4 years. LAB members sit within either of two committees and report formally back to the MAT Board termly.

The 2 committees are:

Teaching and Learning and SEN Safeguarding and Wellbeing who meet collectively once a term.
