Weekly homework has been introduced to give parents an understanding and insight of what has been covered in English/Maths (alternative weeks).  I am aware that other schools within the cluster, do not provide mid-year reports and only have 2 meeting opportunities per year. At Birches, parents are invited to three parent evenings, Autumn, Spring and Summer term to discuss how their child is attaining as well as an open-door policy. Parents also receive a summative report in July celebrating the child's achievements over the year and targets for the next academic year.

It gives children the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences to equip them with their next stage of learning. The curriculum is designed to meet the needs of all children to help children apply what they have learnt with increasing fluency and independence.</li> </ul>

		- We teach and follow Birches' Golden Expectations, Birches Values and Fundamental British Values. This is delivered both discreetly in class and as a school focus through our assemblies and themed weeks (Anti Bullying/Children in Need/ Harvest/ ECO) understanding right and wrong, how to be responsible and respectful.
		- We pride ourselves on promoting an inclusive environment where every child is valued regardless of faith, culture, race, beliefs, religion and disability this is of paramount importance to our school.
		<ul> <li>All children thrive together understanding that difference is positive and individual characteristics make people unique within school and beyond. Preparing children to participate and contribute positively to life in modern Britain.</li> <li>Our RE curriculum teaches children the knowledge of, and respect of different faiths, feelings and values and identify what we share in common across cultural, religious, ethnic and communities.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>We are a Healthy school and promote healthy eating and drinking, physical exercise, all children access the outdoors as much as possible and participate in the daily mile, relax and ready to learn, Go Noodle sessions throughout the day.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Children are taught about the online and offline risks. Children actively contribute to their class Risk Assessment on how to keep safe in the classroom.</li> <li>We have a Local Authority approved Behaviour Policy, in which all children understand. Children are aware of rewards (Gold Star, Merits, Mathlete, Star Writer, Class of the Week etc) and consequences. These are all communicated in an age-appropriate way.</li> </ul>

Finally, your thoughts, comments and views are valued by us a school team. We will continue to develop actions to address these issues or comments raised as part of our ongoing school improvement. Current actions implemented as a result of feedback:

'More advanced notice where parent participation is requested would be helpful'

Historically, diary dates for the month are given on the first day of the month and advanced noticed is given for events such as Christmas Plays. We aim to provide notice for school lunches with a minimum of 2 weeks.

From January, a key dates overview has been provided to parents. Any events happening at the start of February have also been provided so that any upcoming events can be planned for. Teachers have discussed this in our staff meeting and we have agreed that parents should be given as much notice as possible due to work commitments and aim to always give 2 weeks' notice.

Communication remains an issue. It's much better having one platform now and MM works well for prompts, congratulations and reminders. However, when letters are only accessible via this platform they become inaccessible once a certain time has lapsed. Please ensure important letters are always accessible to parents on the school website. Parents look there in the first instance. Really important letters should be printed.

We have contacted Marvellous Me about trying to get more subjects listed so it can help parents to identify quickly what they are looking for i.e. Spellings as it was brought to attention that it was overwhelming. We hope you find this more accessible.

All letters are always uploaded to the website. We appreciate that you may need to find something quickly on the website, so we have created a Quick Link on Marvellous Me which takes you to all the letters on the school website.

Finally, thank you to those who left a comment-here are some of them- to say it boosted staff morale in a meeting is understatement! So thank you!
